Dear Parents and carers,

The children returned to school after the Easter break full of enthusiasm and eager to learn more about our new topic of 'Growing'. This will be followed by the topic of Water in the second half term.

**Communication, Language and Literacy:** We will be reading a wide range of books, exploring characters and settings. The children will be encouraged to act out stories, draw pictures and produce writing based on themes from the texts. We will be reading a variety of rich and engaging texts to bring the topic alive, such as 'How to Grow a Dinosaur', 'Cave Baby' and 'The Selfish Crocodile' and various non-fiction texts. This will provide the children with a wide range of meaningful writing opportunities.

The children will continue their phonics learning. As children progress through the phases, new sounds will be added to their 'phonics book' for them to practise using at home. Please try to read with your child every day so they can incorporate their phonic knowledge in their reading and continue to develop their enjoyment of books.

**Maths:** The children will continue to learn through both formal teaching of concepts and their exploration of the classroom provision. They will enjoy a range of stimulating practical activities that will develop their skills in counting, calculations and shape, space and measure. We will be developing children's skills in recording and explaining the processes they go through when undertaking mathematical calculations, problems and puzzles.

**Understanding the World:** As part of understanding our world, we will be growing plants, learning about the life cycle of butterflies and frogs, as well as, going on bug hunts. We will also be finding out more about different localities such as the park and beach through school visits, as they provide great opportunities for children to gain an understanding of different locations and environments compared to our locality.

**P.E:** Children's physical development will progress through a mixture of discrete PE sessions and an enabling learning environment. Children will have a range of activities on offer which develop their fine and gross motor skills. P.E. kits need to be brought into school on Monday and returned home on Friday. P.E. takes place both in and outside of the building, so please ensure your child has tracksuit bottoms or leggings.

**Google Classroom Challenge:** Your child has a log in for Google Classroom. Challenges will continue to be set on this. This is an enjoyable way of sharing learning experiences. To support your child with their learning we will be continuing to set challenges for you to share at home. You can record your learning through photographs, drawings and annotations. Challenges will be set on **Thursdays**. Your

child will also receive a decodable Phonics book, we request that these be kept in your child's book bag so that we can change them weekly.

As well as increasing children's self-esteem and confidence, trips are hugely successful when they are part of our long-term curriculum planning and have clear links to the classroom. We introduced a 'pay as you go' method. Your prompt payment via MCAS is very much appreciated.
