International Eisteddfod, Llangollen 2022

Our amazing Chamber Choir did us all proud yesterday at the prestigious and world-famous International Eisteddfod in the small, beautiful town of Llangollen, Wales. You can watch their spinetingling performance on-line at Llangollen.TV – Llangollen International Eisteddfod. Every single member of the choir sang with complete joy and passion, leaving them all with memories that will last a lifetime. Yes, it was a competition, but of far more importance was the fact that the experience of singing in such an amazing place made them all so happy! Equally important was the incredible support from so many parents and extended family members. I would like to extend my heart-felt thanks to all who were able to come. If it is of interest to you, Deansfield were placed 4th out of 9 choirs. The choirs in the top three places have been regularly winning competitions for many years. But we most definitely held our own. The adjudicators' comments about us are wonderful: "You are a choir who know how to sing quietly and engage the audience. You shaped the phrases beautifully. The dynamic range was great and it had a big impact. Really convincing interpretations throughout. Beautifully centred singing from the outset. You built the momentum with real security and skill. The harmony parts engaged well. You gave a really convincing performance".

In my opinion there was really nothing in it between the top 4 choirs! I am sure different adjudicators would have called it differently.

Finally, here is what some of choir think:

"Today was such fun! It all started at 5.55am which might sound early, but I was surprisingly energetic" (Leyla) "I loved the excitement of getting ready to go on stage, and listening to other choirs" (Elsa) "Before I knew it, I was singing... hands trembling...
